

# Principal's Weekly Update - May 1st, 2020

This week I have again included the time commitments/expectations from the government for you, just in case you missed it last week.

## **Time Commitments/Expectations**

In looking at planning for remote learning, we recognize that it isn't sustainable for parents, particularly those with younger children or still working, to maintain a school day schedule. With that in mind, the province has set minimum expectations for learning time as follows:

Grade	Academic Time
Kindergarten- Grade 4	5 hours/week
Grade 5-8	10 hours/ week

This learning time will be a combination of on-line opportunities (whole group, small group or individual conferences), independent assignments and parent supported work. This should not all be screen time.

These times are the minimum expectations.

This week, aside from my regular teleconferences and meetings, I was lucky enough to be included on the Gr. 2 and Gr. 3 classroom Zoom meetings! It was wonderful to see so many of the students and hear what they have been doing, and things that they will be doing academically going forward. One of my goals over the next two weeks, will be to participate in at least one classroom meeting with each class. That will be the best part of my week!
