# Principal's Weekly Update - November 6th, 2020

As you are all aware, our city has been placed in the **Critical/Red Response Level Zone** by Public Health, while schools in Winnipeg have remained in the **Orange Response Level Plan.** 

Public Health officials are advising the Winnipeg Metropolitan Region that anyone who is symptomatic must self-isolate, along with the entire household. The symptomatic individual needs to stay in their own room, and if possible, use their own bathroom and not use common

I have been in meetings this week regarding school planning in anticipation of being placed in the **Red Response/Critical Level Plan**. Therefore, I am sharing information provided by the government regarding in-school learning/remote learning, as it will look different than it did in the spring.

Here is how it will affect us at SCCS:

**Gr. 7 & 8 students** will be asked to remain at home to engage in daily remote learning. Students in Kindergarten to Gr. 6 will only be allowed in school if their parents fall under the Critical Services Workers Tier 1 or Tier 2 definition. I've included the government definition for your information.

# Critical Services Worker (CSW) Definition

In a Critical (Red) response level, schools and school divisions will endeavour to accommodate Kindergarten to Grade 6 children of CSWs <u>who</u> <u>cannot make alternative care arrangements</u>. Various limitations will affect the number of children of CSWs that a school can safely manage. It is understood that schools/school divisions may not have the space required to accommodate all Kindergarten to Grade 6 children of CSWs while maintaining two metres of physical distancing. Therefore, a prioritization system is needed.

Priority access will be given to health care providers. Other CSWs will be eligible and prioritized by schools/school divisions as follows:

# Tier One:

Health/Health Services

• *Kindergarten to Grade 12 Education Providers (all teachers, administrators, and support staff)* 

Child Care Workers

- Law Enforcement
- Corrections Workers
- Fire and Paramedic First Responders
- Direct Social Services and Child Protection Workers

#### Tier Two:

Additional Critical Service Providers (This may include people who provide essential services to Manitobans such as front-line natural resource workers, gas station attendants, grocery store staff, and hospital/clinic support staff, such as those listed in I Essential Services Act at <u>https://web2.gov.mb.ca/laws/statutes/ccsm/e145e.php</u>.

# Schools and school divisions may also use their discretion to accommodate high-risk students in order to mitigate serious concerns.

Therefore, I have already begun preparing our **Red Response/Critical Level Plan** in preparation for this possible move. If you are a parent of a Kindergarten to Gr. 6 child(ren), and fall under the Tier 1 category(1 or both parents), you will be contacted in the event of a shift to the new response level to see if you are not able to make alternative care arrangements and will be sending your child(ren) to school. Depending on parent Tier 1 response, Tier 2 category parents may also be contacted.

More information will be shared if we move to the **Red Response/Critical Level Plan**, and a detailed plan will be shared in regards to the remote learning structure for all grade levels.

As always, I will continue to be transparent in my communication as I learn more information and will work hard to make sure that this information is shared with the school community in a timely manner.
