been concrete and now grass again in the backyard, the uniform has had many variations over the years, the school crest and name also has had some changes, computers and smart boards have replaced typewriters, the staff is entirely lay people-with one exception, and probably the biggest change, the school has been passed on to the parishes.

Despite all these changes (large and small) there is something special engrained in the fabric of the school that has survived the test of time. This was clear to me five years ago when my husband and I came to the Kindergarten Open House...it felt like I was coming back home. Bazaars and Teas

During the 40's and 50's bazaars were held yearly in the fall in the recreation room. All proceeds went to help the missions.

The windows and walls were covered with white sheets. Various tables were set up around the room. Each table was the responsibility of a Sister.

There was a fish pond which was always very popular with the younger children. A company would donate some toys that they couldn't sell because of defects and Sister Collette would repair them and these were used for some of the prizes.

There were a great variety of crafts that were made by the Sisters, some of them were very creative in this area. For example, they cut a pretty picture from a used greeting card and pasted it on a small jam lid, put a border around it and then added a loop at the back so you could hang it up. There were also knitted and crocheted items. There was a raffle wheel that had numbers on it. Little boards with numbers on them were sold and if your number came up when they spun the wheel you won the prize. We think this was used later on at some Teas.

There was a table for candy. Do you remember black balls, 3 for a penny, also mackintosh toffee, candied apples and chocolate bars and other favorites?

When the new annex was built in 1962 the Bazaar was held in the gym. There were basically the same ideas, handicrafts, raffles and the ever popular fish pond.

Each class would make decorations that were hung in the gym, hallways and cafeteria. Parents, grandparents loved to see the art work. Tea, coffee and dainties were served in the cafeteria

In the 80's the Bazaar became the Spring Tea. All money raised went to the school. The raffle was held in conjunction with the Tea. It was a lot of work. It became a big fundraiser and it was difficult to find a convener. A lot depended on donations big and small. Sister Edna Lavoie donated a lot of her creative sewing and knitting. She has a real knack for sewing different pieces that were useful besides being unique. Someone would bring a decorated cake for the bake table and the volunteers would quickly have a raffle for the cake. There were a lot of impromptu moments. Big donations would come in at the last minute and that was the start of the Silent Auction.

There was so much going that many volunteers were needed. The gym was set up as a Tea Room with a long table down the middle. There were tea pourers, who were local politicians, priests, Mother Superior, Principal, Board Chairperson, etc. They would pour in half hour shifts, used the Silver Tea sets. Small tables were set up with tablecloths, vase and flower, tea cups and saucers. Junior high students would serve the tables, along with the help of their mother or father. They did their job well.

The crowd pleaser was the children's performances. It was a big attraction and therefore caused a lot of congestion in the gym.

In the cafeteria were the bake table, handicrafts and white elephant. The main entrance was set up for the Rainbow and Silent Auctions. The recreation room was the Kids Corner, fish pond, bean bag toss, popcorn, cupcakes, movies, etc.

We can't forget about the kitchen where egg salad, ham or tuna open faced buns would emerge and the plates of dainties. Thanks to all those dishwashers.
