



Our 15-Classroom Annex

Our new 170 x 105 ft. annex will accommodate 350 students. Seventy more than the present enrolment. This includes 90 boarders from Western and Eastern Canadian provinces and from several States of the Union.


The new two-story building contains fifteen classrooms, a cafeteria and kitchen, a gymnasium and auditorium, and a swimming pool. It was erected by the Oblate sisters at a cost of \$250,000 under the supervision of Mr. Thompson of St. Boniface. Founded in 1906 by Archbishop Langevin, St. Charles has earned a national reputation for the calibre of its teachers who now number 22, all Oblate Sisters, whose mother house is located in St. Boniface. Bilingual instruction is given to all students. - excerpt from the Sunday Herald Winnipeg, 1963


