## **AN INTERVIEW WITH ROBYN POWELL**

Many of you in your time at St Charles have been lucky enough to spend some time with Robyn Powell. As a former student, parent, board chair, current past board chair, and outgoing alumni committee chair, its safe to say few people have spent as much time on a volunteer basis at the school as Robyn has. With that in mind, we thought it would be a good time to have a guick chat about her role on the Alumni committee.

JG: Do you have any highlights you could share from all of your time at St. Charles?

**RP:** When our daughter started kindergarten in the fall of 2006 the enrollment was at 217 students which seemed like such an improvement from when my parents were Board members in the 1980s,

As many of you have heard, the St Charles community is saying goodbye to our Principal at the end of

the 2023-24 school year. I say our Principal because she is just that. Tammy has spent decades devoting her life to educating our children, but she has also been there for us as parents, to help support and guide us through difficult times, and to celebrate along side us as our children reached goals and achievements throughout the years.

Earlier this spring I spent some time with Tammy interviewing her for this article, because like many, I didn't know her whole story. And what better time to learn her story than when we prepare to say goodbye.

When Tammy was a little girl, she played school all the time, and never once considered pursuing any other career. She just knew she would be a teacher. Fast forward to her university graduation and she immediately entered the education world as a substitute, but knew from the beginning she wanted her own classroom.

#### AN INTERVIEW WITH TAMMY NARYNSKI

Luckily after just one year as a sub, Tammy began teaching grade one at St Maurice School. She spent 17 years there, 12 of which were teaching grade one, and 5 more teaching kindergarten.

Lucky for us, Tammy's principal left St Maurice for St Charles, and she soon followed. Being closer to home, Tammy began her tenure at St Charles teaching grade one yet again. She always loved teaching primary and envisioned spending her career in the primary years. Soon she would be in charge of a pilot project combining grades one and two. It didn't take long before her natural leadership skills were noticed and she was approached to apply for the vice principal role. Despite having never considered the administration path prior, she knew she could succeed as an administrator and decided to apply. Just as she showed a dedication to her education from a young age, she prepared for the interview with a list of 150 potential questions. Tammy became a teaching Vice Principal for 6 years, then transitioned to a half time teaching role, teaching grades 6, 7 & 8 Religion. Before too long, Tammy was then approached by the board to consider the Principal position. After some careful consideration for the big step, Tammy's husband reminder her that "she owes it to herself to try". Even though Tammy describes taking on the role of Principal as one of the biggest challenges of her career, I think the results speak for themselves.

There have been plenty of rewarding moments in Tammy's career. To no surprise her first answer to that question was her students. "... all the things I have learned from them are such a huge part of the educator I became." Becoming an administrator, and navigating through COVID also proved to be rewarding, which she did as one of the leaders of this St Charles Community. Being approached by the Superintendent to sit on the Manitoba Federation of Independent Schools Board of Directors was another rewarding experience, and an ultimate sign of respect for her dedication to education.

When asked who has inspired her over the years, "one of my former Vice Principals years ago. He and I had many discussions about being an educator, and he gave terrific advice which instilled confidence in my teaching abilities." Of course her students also inspired her, are more recently, our current past chair of the St Charles Board of Directors, Robyn Powell, and current Board Chair Trish Farkas "... have definitely inspired me. Their belief in me and giving me the opportunity to do this job is amazing, and I'm so grateful to both of them." As an educator, I asked Tammy what are some of the biggest things she has learned over her career. "Every child deserves respect, and it doesn't matter how old they are. If they know you respect them, it makes your job as an educator much easier." She continued "I have also learned that sometimes you must just listen. Not only with children but also your staff." She also mentioned that reputation is everything "I've always appreciated that and held it sacred." Safe to say the St Charles reputation has only benefited from Tammy's time with us, and will continue with the team she leaves behind.

When asked if she has any regrets, "Education has been my entire life... I have faith everything in my career happened the way it was supposed to." Which leads us to her successor, Mrs. Aneta Prettie. "Aneta and I have worked together for the past 19 years. We started when she was hired to teach grade 2, and I was teaching grade 1. For the past 5 years we have worked as the administrative team. I couldn't think of anyone that I would want more to take over my role. She is professional, intelligent, and she loves SCCS as much as I do. I have great respect for Aneta, and that she is the best choice to take over my role at the end of this school year."

We are all going to miss Tammy, and to no surprise she will miss the community. "One of my favourite parts of this job is getting to know the students, staff, and parents. I wish I had more time each day to chat with people, I'll miss making

those connections." Lastly, she'll miss Mrs. Prettie. "Aneta is my right hand, we are such a strong administrative team."

My final question for Tammy was if she had any parting words for the St Charles families, past and present. "I hope that they know that everyone I have encountered has left an impression on me, and they have helped shape the leader, and person that I am today. I have appreciated their support, understanding, trust, and kindness throughout the years. I'm a better person because of them and so very grateful."

As I finish this article honouring our principal, Tammy Narynski, I'm reminded of a quote. "A teacher has two jobs, fill young minds with knowledge, but more importantly give those minds a compass." On behalf of us all, thank you Tammy for giving us knowledge, and helping us use our compass.






