WILDLIFE HAVEN







On Thursday, the Grade 1, 3-4, and 4 classes enjoyed a visit from Wildlife Haven. The students had the opportunity to meet **three ambassador animals** and learn about their unique stories and how they came to be at Wildlife Haven.

We were introduced to Milan, a Mississippi kite—a type of raptor, like a hawk, that typically lives in the USA. We also met Ash, a great grey owl who was found and raised by humans. Lastly, we met Basil, a corn snake originally from the USA, brought here as an egg and later released into the wild. These animal ambassadors taught us the importance of keeping wildlife in their natural habitats and what to do if we encounter a wild animal that may be injured—always call for professional help.

PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES are scheduled for next week, and we encourage all parents to



take advantage of this opportunity to connect with their child's teachers. You can book appointments with your child's homeroom teacher to discuss their progress and address any questions or concerns. Specialist teachers for subjects like Music, French, and Physical Education are also available for appointments. Our Resource teacher and Administration will be on hand if you need additional support or have any general questions.


- There is BLINE on Monday.
