
PRINCIPAL'S WEEKLY UPDATE AND IMPORTANT INFORMATION

ST. NICHOLAS DAY ASSEMBLY

St. Nicholas, also known as Nicholas of Myra, was a 4th-century bishop famous for his generosity, care for the poor, and love for children. His feast day, celebrated on December 6, honors his legacy as a model of Christian charity and kindness. His life teaches us about the importance of generosity, humility, and love for others, especially the less fortunate. At St. Charles Catholic School, the feast of St. Nicholas is celebrated with joy and reflection:

- 1. **Assembly and Prayer Service**: Students come together to pray and learn about St. Nicholas' life and virtues.
- 2. **Shoes Out and Candy Inside**: In a nod to tradition, students leave their shoes out, and small treats, are placed inside, symbolizing the saint's generosity.
- 3. **Visit from St. Nicholas**: A special guest, dressed as St. Nicholas, visits the students to remind them of his story and inspire them to follow his example.

We explored the diversity of living things, focusing on **arthropods**. Students learned about the characteristics, diets, habitats, and adaptations of crustaceans, myriapods, insects, and arachnids. Using their knowledge, 6M designed and created their own unique arthropods using household items. Each project was accompanied by a detailed brochure and a lab report outlining their scientific design process. The completed projects were then showcased in the library, allowing all students to admire their creativity and effort. Great job, everyone!
