

Even if the intentions are good, this puts added pressure on our staff and compromises the careful safety procedures we have in place. We are asking for your support and cooperation to help reinforce these expectations. It takes a collective effort to keep our school safe, respectful, and focused on learning. Thank you for helping us protect the integrity of our learning environment and maintain the safety and security of our community.
